#### Bluffton High School vs's Hilton Head Island

If Jim Corbin's sister would've been there, he probably would've kissed her.

Corbin's Bluffton High School golf team pulled even with archrival Hilton Head Island High School on Tuesday, as the Bobcats and Seahawks carded matching 173s on the front nine at Pinecrest Golf Club.

For the Bobcats, though, this tie was a whole lot



*Heather Wiquist* more rewarding than locking lips with a sibling — the *Kaitlin O'Sullivan* Seahawks had finished first in each of the teams' four head-to-head meetings previously this season.

"It's good to see a couple of our girls play to their potential," said Corbin, who got a career-best 41 from senior Jenna Bruno and a 42 from eighth-grader Sammie Buchanan. It might have been enough for a victory if not for Seahawks senior Kaitlin O'Sullivan, who grabbed medalist honors for the second consecutive meet. For most of her round, O'Sullivan was more concerned with frizzies than birdies on a wet and windy day — "I didn't really play that great, and the rain was not helping my hair," she said — but she knocked an 80-yard pitching wedge to 20 feet on the par-4 ninth and rolled in the ensuing birdie putt to finish at 1-over-par 37 and unknowingly save the Seahawks from defeat. "I wasn't really thinking about it being a game-winning stroke," O'Sullivan said. "But I guess I should've been." The Seahawks needed a good round from O'Sullivan more than ever, because No. 1 player Rachel Uremovich had her worst day as a Seahawk. Uremovich, who was the medalist in all three meets she had played before Tuesday, fought a balky putter en route to a 43.


Meanwhile, the Bobcats were getting a career day from Bruno, who almost skipped the golf season this year to focus on lacrosse. Bluffton would have been lost without her Tuesday, as she turned less-than-favorable conditions into an advantage. "I'm kind of the opposite of everybody else — I like it cool," Bruno said. "It was kind of everything today. I just played pretty well." She wasn't alone. Beaufort High School carded its best team score of the season, finishing at 221. Kylie Gratton led the Eagles with a 48, matching the career-best she set last week at Dataw Island Golf Club.

"We're seeing progress, but it's kind of frustrating because it's the end of the season and I know most of these girls won't pick up a club again until August," Eagles coach Liza Bethel said. Bethel has watched her players lower their scores one by one, and Tuesday was Lindsey Ware's turn. Ware shot a career-best 56. "Lindsey made a big improvement today," Bethel said. "She has been improving her game every week." Corbin and Seahawks coach Steve Henry are trying to arrange an 18-hole match between the Bobcats and Seahawks on Tuesday, and the same three teams will get together to play the back nine at Pinecrest on Oct. 11.

#### CofC Opens Links at Stono Ferry Golf Learning Center

**Charleston, S.C.** – College of Charleston women's golf coach Jamie Futrell, men's golf coach Mark McEntire and Greg Wood, general manager for The Links at Stono Ferry held a grand opening press conference on Wednesday to introduce the Cougars' new golf practice facility, the Stono Ferry Golf Learning Center.

The facilities main building is 2,358 square feet and consists of a lounge, eating area with a kitchen, men's and women's locker rooms, a conference room and men's and women's coach's offices.

The two indoor hitting bays are 1,877 square feet and have a club repair area and an 860 square foot efficiency apartment upstairs. The hitting bays are equipped with the K-Vest product suite, the V-1 Pro video system and the Vector Pro.

The K-Vest is a portable golf instructional system that uses wireless sensors to capture motion faster than a standard video system. It helps coaches capture and analyze a player's swing motion in real-time 3-D.

The V-1 Pro video system gives coaches the ability to capture a gold swing and provide analysis through interactive playback of the recorded motion.

The Vector Pro delivers launch monitor data with video swing analysis for both fittings and lessons.

The Links at Stono Ferry Golf Learning Center is located at 4812 Stono Links Drive in Hollywood, S.C. (843-763-1817).

#### Senior Azalea golf tournament at the Country Club of Charleston

**Charleston SC** - Walt Martin's round of 67 Friday matched his age and earned the retired U.S. Navy captain from Oakton, Va., a two-shot victory over Larry Boswell in the nationally recognized tournament for amateurs 55 and older. Martin, who was stationed in Charleston in the mid- to late-90s with his wife, who was the commanding officer of the Navy Hospital, posted three birdies, an eagle and just one bogey to finish the tournament at 2-under-par 211. Boswell had a final-round 70 for a 213 total. Bill Smunk of Kingstree was another golfer to post a round in the 60s, a final-round 69, and finished in a tie for third at 215. Bob Hullender of San Antonio, led start to finish and won the Super Seniors division for players 65 and older, shooting a final round 70 for a 210 total. Brodie Baker of Bermuda Run, N.C., was second at 72—216. Although he was eligible to compete in the Super Senior division, Martin elected to play in the regular division this week. Last week, he finished first in the Super Seniors division in a Society of Seniors tournament in Columbia. Martin said he made three "horse gaggers" but missed several shorter putts during the final round. He birdied the par-4 seventh hole, then reached the par-5 ninth in two shots and drained a 45-foot putt for eagle.

#### 46th Carolinas Senior Amateur Championship

**Mount Pleasant, SC** - Paul Simson of Raleigh, NC captured his 16th CCA title by claiming the Carolinas Senior Amateur Championship at Dunes West Golf Club. The 56 year-old Simson edged defending champion Joe Vignati of Bluffton, SC, by four strokes. Vignati made a last-round charge with a tournament-low 67. "This is a great feeling," said Simson, an

insurance executive. "It's nice to add my name to a CGA event that I have not yet won." Simson, the 2006 British Senior Amateur champion, carded six birdies in his final round which included all of the par 3 holes. He bogied holes 11 and 16. The Carolinas Senior Amateur Championship is conducted by the Carolinas Golf Association.

### Men's Golf Begins Season with 11th-place Finish

**FLORENCE**, S.C. – Improving on his second round total by 12 strokes, Justin Martinson fired a one-under 71 in the final round of the Raines Development Group/Days Inn Invitational.



The freshman helped guide the CSU men's golf squad to a tie for 11th place with the lowest individual total among Buccaneers in the third round.

Furman won the team title, using a 285 in the final round to score the victory after finishing the first day in fifth place. Michael McGrady took the individual crown, finishing at four-under, three strokes better than his nearest competition.

Martinson finished the tournament in a tie for 55th with a score of 234 (80-83-71).

Herve Gevers was the top overall finisher for the Buccaneers, finishing with 11 birdies in the three rounds, ranking him a tie for fourth among the 80 participants. He shot a 76 (+4) in the final round to give him a three-round total of 221 (70-75-76), placing him in a tie for 16th.

Just one stroke behind his teammate in the final standings, Carl Petersson matched Gevers 76 in the final round. He placed among the tournament leaders in both par-three and par-five scoring average. Over the two day event, he played the four par-three holes even and averaged 4.58 strokes, shooting five under overall, on par-five holes. His 36 pars also placed him among the tournament leaders.

Ben Rowe shot an 81 in the third round, finishing with a score of 242 (85-76-81) to place 74th overall and Jim Hough finished 80th after recording an 85 in the final round to give him a total of 262 (93-84-85).

### Jordan-Higgins Named Co-Golfer of the Week


CHARLOTTE, N.C. – With a tied for 15th-place finish at the Great Smokies Women's Collegiate, sophomore Olivia Jordan-Higgins earned Big South Conference Choice Hotels co-Women's Golfer of the Week honors, the league announced today.

Jordan-Higgins shares the honor with Jutta Degerman of Winthrop, one of the golfers to finish in a tie with Jordan-Higgins at the Great Smokies Women's Collegiate.

The Lady Buccaneer sophomore finished a total score of 149, carding rounds of 72 and 77 in the two-day event. For the third straight tournament, Jordan-Higgins earned at least a share of the lowest score among CSU golfers, tying with teammate Katrin Rumpf this weekend for the best score on the team. She posted seven birdies in the two rounds, and tied for second in the tournament with a 4.00 stroke average on par four holes.









Patriots finish ninth at URI's Adams Cup of Newport Tournament



NEWPORT, RI - Despite a finalround one-under-par 71 by sophomore Christopher Couch, Francis Marion University fell back two positions to finish ninth in the final team standings at the Adams Cup of Newport Tournament, hosted by the University of Rhode Island.FMU junior Andrew Pitcher, who held a two-shot lead in the individual standings after 36 holes, shot a finalround 77 to finish tied for fifth at five-over-par 221. He had fired rounds of 70 and 74 on Tuesday. Couch finished tied for 30th position (78-81-71=230), while FMU junior Peter McGibney tied for 36th (70-85-77=232). He shared the first-round lead with Pitcher after the opening 18 holes.

#### Other Francis Marion Golfers: Junior Keith Crowley (81-76-83=240) who finished 59th, and Sophomore Jonathan Lavin (93-79-78=250), who tied for 75th spot.

Wichita State University (890) led from start to finish and finished 11 shots ahead of the University of Southern Mississippi (901). The host school and the University of Maryland tied for third at 902, followed by the University of Texas-San Antonio (905), USC Aiken (906), the University of the Pacific (909), Furman University (911), FMU (912), and Long Beach State University and Georgetown University (920). The field consisted of 15 teams.

### **USGA Policy on Gambling**

The Definition of an amateur golfer provides that an amateur golfer is one who plays the game as a non-remunerative and nonprofit-making sport. When gambling motives are introduced, problems can arise which threaten the integrity of the game.

The distinction between playing for prize money, which violates the Rules of Amateur Status, and gambling, which does not, is essential to the Rules of Amateur Status. The USGA urges amateur golfers to seek USGA guidance whenever it is unclear whether the prize format constitutes playing for prize money or gambling and, in the absence of such guidance, not to play for cash prizes. Such a course of action would ensure that no one jeopardizes his amateur status.

The USGA does not object to informal wagering among individual golfers or teams of golfers when the players in general know each other, participation in the wagering is optional and is limited to the players, the sole source of all money won by the players is advanced by the players on themselves or their own teams and the amount of money involved is such that the primary purpose is the playing of the game for enjoyment.

On the other hand, organized events open to the general public or designed and promoted to create cash prizes are not approved by the USGA. Golfers participating in such events without first irrevocably waiving their right to cash prizes are deemed by the USGA to be playing for prize money.

The USGA is opposed to and urges its Member Clubs, all golf associations and all other sponsors of golf competitions to prohibit types of gambling such as: (1) Calcuttas, (2) other auction pools, (3) pari-mutuels and (4) any other forms of gambling organized for general participation or permitting participants to bet on someone other than themselves or their teams. The USGA may deny amateur status, entry in USGA Championships and membership on USGA teams for international competitions to players whose activities in connection with golf gambling, whether organized or individual, are considered by the USGA to be contrary to the best interests of golf.





#### Galbavy wins chip-off to claim 40 Plus title

North Augusta SC - Ed Galbavy of Mt. Pleasant defeated Steve Scott of Mauldin in a chip-off to claim low gross at the 40 Plus event held at Mount Vintage Plantation Golf Club. Both Galbavy and Scott shot an even par round of 72 on the beautiful Tom Jackson layout. Rick Schroder, Jeff Pope, and Bill Hathaway all finished at one over par 73 to finish tied for third.

In the net division, Mark Creel carded a five under par 67 to claim top honors.

The 40 Plus is a series of events conducted for the "baby boomer" golfers across South Carolina, over the age of 40. The field consisted of 120 players, playing on the 6603 yard Mount Vintage Plantation Golf Club in North Augusta, SC. This event was the fourth of seven 40 Plus events the SCGA will conduct in 2007.



#### Lori Hatcher Named Head Coach for Women's Golf

Charleston SC - Citadel appoints Lori Hatcher as the head coach for women's golf.

A 2004 graduate of Youngstown State, Hatcher earned her degree in marketing and was a four-year letter winner for the women's golf team. In 2003, Hatcher led the Penguins in becoming the first YSU women's program to earn a Horizon League Conference Championship winning the inaugural league women's golf title by 10 strokes over Loyola. Along with the team championship, Hatcher won the individual championship and earned All-Conference and All-Tournament honors. Following her championship junior season, Hatcher repeated her honors on the All-Conference and All-Tournament team.

Prior to her collegiate debut, Hatcher played in the highly esteemed United States Girls Amateur tournament as well as in various tournaments with the American Junior Golf Association. In 2000, she won the P.J. Boatwright Challenge Cup Junior State Championship in Pennsylvania. "Lori brings a wealth of knowledge about college golf from her playing experience at Youngstown State where she was a conference champion", said Senior Women's Administrator, Kelly Simpson. "She possesses an enthusiasm for the game that I feel will carry over to the team members and have an immediate impact on the women's golf program."

A native of Wheeling, W.Va. Hatcher taught golf for six years at The Oglebay Resort where she was an instructor in the junior golf department. Following graduation from Youngstown State, she worked for Goodwill as a director of vocational services. After moving to Charleston in 2006, Hatcher served as an assistant at a local doctor's office.

#### Newberry men claim Mid-Carolina Invitational title



**PROSPERITY, S.C.** - The Newberry College men's golf team kicked their fall season into high gear Saturday by winning the Mid-Carolina Invitational at Mid-Carolina Country Club. The win is the second in a row for the Indians at Mid-Carolina, where they are the host school. Newberry shot an even par 288 in the

morning round, and finished with a 2-over 290 in the afternoon. Catawba College's Eric Schmehl claimed top medalist honors. Schmehl, the only player to shoot under par in both rounds, fired a 2-under 68 in the morning and a tournament-best 4-under 68 in the afternoon. Schmehl's overall 138 was the only under par score in the tournament. The Indians were paced by freshman Ben Lown (North Augusta, S.C.). In just his second tournament as a collegian, Lown finished second individually with an even par 144 after shooting 74 in the morning and 70 in the afternoon. Teammate and fellow freshman Daniel Stanley (Inman, S.C.) finished third individually, shooting 72 in the morning and 73 in the afternoon to combine for a 1-over par 145. Another Newberry rookie, John Allen Meetze (Chapin, S.C.), finished in a five-way tie for fourth place individually at 2-over 146 after shooting 72 in the morning and 74 in the morning. Newberry junior Billy Burrows (Bluffton, S.C.) finished the morning round tied for the individual lead with Schmehl after firing a 2-under par 70, but he faded in the afternoon, shooting a 5-over 77. Still, Burrows' 3-over total of 147 was good for solo ninth place.



#### Dogfight at The Neuse

CLAYTON, N.C. - The Newberry College men's golf team finished third out of 14 teams competing at the Dogfight at The Neuse that concluded this past Tuesday. Held at The Neuse golf course in Clayton, N.C., the Indians completed play seven strokes behind Pfeiffer University and four strokes behind Cape Fear Community College (N.C.).

Newberry shot 304 on Monday and 301 on Tuesday for a combined total of 605.

Individually, Newberry's Ben Lown (North Augusta, S.C.) tied for third place after shooting 145 over two days.

Lown's two-over par showing was not the only top 10 finish for the Indians. Fellow freshman Daniel Stanley (Inman, S.C.) completed rounds of 76 and 74 en route to a final standing tied for 10th place.

Sophomore Brandon Burnside (North Augusta, S.C.) and freshman John Allen Meetze (Chapin, S.C.) finished with two-day scores of 154 and 157 respectively.

#### Lady Indian golf ranked 24th in national poll

NEW YORK, N.Y. - In the second Golf World/NGCA Division II coaches poll, the Newberry women's golf team is ranked 24th in the nation. The Lady Indians dropped five spots from the first poll that was released back in August. Newberry has only competed in one tournament in the fall portion of the 2007 schedule. The Lady Indians finished in third place in the Lady Falcon Invitational with sophomore Franziska Blum (Schweinfurt, Germany) winning the individual title.Senior Ashley Ratcliff (Myrtle Beach, S.C.) finished in the top 10 as well, with a 19-over par performance and in an eighth place tie.





*Men's Golf Among Nation's Elite* COLUMBIA - South Carolina men's golf team ranks second in the nation this week in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. Sophomore George Bryan IV is ranked second in the individual standings as well. A mathematical formula that links teams and players based on common opponents based on strength of schedule and won-

lost-tied record, the Performance Index gives the most objective view of the teams and individuals playing well over a set period of time.

In their season-opening tournament, the Gamecocks tied Alabama for first, yielding the team title in a playoff. With 18 teams in the field, the Gamecocks' record stands at 16-0-1. South Carolina benefited greatly from the strength of the field it dominated as 11 other teams at the Carpet Capital Collegiate were ranked in the to 25. The Gamecocks are behind only Charlotte in this week's ratings.




