

93rd Amateur Championship

Hilton Head Island, SC - Patrick Rada of Anderson, SC fought off fellow University of South Carolina teammate Warren Thomas of Columbia, SC to win the 93rd Amateur Championship at Long Cove Club. The 19 year old Rada won by a 6 and 4 margin. Rada, whose older brother Travis caddied, fell to early three-down deficit after nine holes, but turned the match around quickly by winning six holes on the second nine holes. Rada went into the lunch break with a three-up lead. Rada maintained his lead with consistent pars on the final 14 holes to win the match. "Winning this event with my family here means so much to me", said the appreciative Rada. "I could not have done it without them." Thomas was crowned the CGA South Carolina Amateur champion a few weeks ago, and defeated Rada in the semifinals to take that title. Rada turned the tables in this event by defeating Thomas in the finals. Over 400 golfers attempted to qualify for the Carolinas Amateur with 154 advancing to the championship proper. The Carolinas Amateur is the oldest Carolinas Golf Association event and began in 1910. Former champions include Harvie Ward, Chip Beck, Billy Joe Patton, Charles Warren and Jonathan Byrd.

Charleston

Dennis and Dambaugh Win Charleston City Junior

Charleston SC - Trey Dennis and Katelyn Dambaugh are the City of Charleston's newest golf champions, winning, respectively, the Boys' and Girls' City Junior Golf Championship, also known as the Al Esposito Junior Championship. Dennis needed extra holes in the 36 hole 2-day event to take the title. Dambaugh was just too much for the other Charleston Girls, winning easily at The Municipal Golf Course in Charleston. Trey Dennis made a birdie 3 on the first playoff hole, edging pars by Kyle Peters and Brannon Parnell. However, the 17th hole proved to be a momentum shifter. Parnell gave back all of his birdies on the back nine with a triple bogey 7, while Dennis made birdie, quickly closing the 4 shot gap. Kyle Peters, the 2007 Charleston Junior Tour Player of the Year points leader, carded the lowest round of the Championship, a four birdie-no bogey round of 68. After all three found the fairway on the opening playoff hole, Dennis hit his approach on the 1st hole to five feet. After watching both his opponents make par saves, Dennis rolled in his birdie to take the 53rd edition of the Al Esposito Junior Championship. Not as much drama surrounded Katelyn Dambaugh, as she waltzed through the field. Her closing 34, with 3 birdies to one bogey, shut the door on any hopes her competitors may have had. Many more City Championships may be in Dambaugh's future, as she is only 12 years old.

Peters Leads Charleston City Junior Golf Tour

Charleston SC - Kyle Peters took the early lead in the Charleston City Junior Golf Tour. Peters' 77 won the first week, leading the Boy's Player of the Year race with 15 points. Evan Doucette is second with 14 points and Patrick Rogers is third with 13 points. As six weeks remain in the tour, including the City Championship, the Player of the Year award is still a wide open competition.

Madison West (15 points) and Lucas McNellis (14 points) lead the Pee Wee Player of the Year race. Jimmy Sudano and Caper Lever are tied at 13 points in 3rd place.

The Player of the Year is determined by the overall points leader at the end of the seven-week tour. 5 points are awarded for participation in the weekly event. 10 points are awarded to the weekly winner, 9 to the runnerup, 8 to 3rd, and so on. The Junior City Championship, July 11th & 12th, will be double-points event. The Boys and Girls Player of the Year will be awarded a scholarship of \$500 for each of the first 4-years he/she attends college.

The Charleston City Junior Golf Tour is open to any junior under the age of 18. The Tour is designed to provide affordable opportunities for juniors to compete on the local level with their peers in a fun and competitive environment. This tour provides an experience to test those junior boys and girls with the desire to compete in high school, college and beyond. This seven-week tour, which includes the Charleston City Junior Championship, will have weekly awards and winners, as well as a Champions Dinner and 2007 Boys and Girls Players of the Year. The Boy's and Girl's Player of the Year will receive a scholarship of \$500 for each of the first 4 year of college. For the win Ebersole claims a trophy, gift certificate, a monogrammed "Match Play Champion" Ping carry bag, and an invitation to compete in the Ginn Cup.





Charity event leaving Strand

After three years in Pawleys Island, the Hannah & Friends Celebrity Golf Classic founded by University of Notre Dame football coach Charlie Weis in 2004 is leaving the Grand Strand.

The tournament was held at True Blue Plantation and Caledonia Golf & Fish Club from 2004-06, but is scheduled this year to be held on Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course near South Bend, Ind., on June 9.

Logistics, expenses and a land business deal that fell through apparently contributed to the tournament's relocation, according to John Springs, the general manager of True Blue and Caledonia who is also on the 20-member board of directors for the tournament beneficiary, the Hannah & Friends Foundation. Springs' wife, Ann Reed Springs, is also on the board. Because many tournament participants are connected to the university, it became less expensive and more convenient to hold the event at Notre Dame.

"They were offered the golf course, and because he brought all his staff and Notre Dame supporters were all involved in it, they thought they would try it up there this year," Springs said.

The tournament benefits children and the families of children affected by autism and global delays, and both the tournament and charitable foundation are named for Hannah Weis, the 11-year-old autistic daughter of Charlie and Maura Weis. Three-year tournament chairman Rex Wicker of Pawleys Island said the 2006 tournament raised nearly \$350,000 and netted about \$200,000 for the foundation.

The tournament's primary purpose is to provide funding for the construction and ongoing operation of a farm featuring a petting zoo and riding program that will provide jobs and recreation for those with developmental disorders - some of whom will live at the farm.

Weis has a condominium in Pawleys Island, and originally planned to build the farm around Georgetown County so he could eventually retire in the area and be close to his daughter.

Springs said property was found on the north end of Charleston County, and the owner also had a relative with a developmental disorder. The land was to be donated and the foundation was going to provide funding for its operation. But the deal fell through on the date of closing last summer.

As a result, the area has lost not only the tournament but probably the farm as well. The Weis' have received permission from the foundation board to procure land in Indiana for the farm, and tracts have already been identified, according to Wicker, who doesn't believe the tournament will return to the Strand.

"They are certainly welcome to come back," Springs said. "I told Maura, 'We'll see how it goes, see what kind of support you get up there.' I'm hoping maybe they won't have as much fun and they'll want to come back down here. Things can always change."

Celebrities who have already committed to participate this year include Rocky Bleier, Reggie Brooks, Mike Golic, Ara Parseghian, Digger Phelps and Rocket Ismail.



"We'll miss not having it," said True Blue head pro Bob Seganti. "It was a nice feather in our cap. We enjoyed everyone's company, and we were happy we could raise hundreds of thousands of dollars for the charity. We're disappointed it's not here.

Graniteville SC - The 32nd Annual GA-SC Junior Team Matches will take place this year July 19-20 in Graniteville, South Carolina at Sage Valley Golf Club. Teams from both states are selected by accepting the top eight finishers at each state's Junior Championship. The South Carolina team was solidified just three weeks ago after the Championship was held at the Country Club of Orangeburg. Finishing as the 2007 Junior Champion and making a return trip to the GA-SC Matches is Chapin's Wesley Bryan who shot a three day total of 13 under par, 200. Jacob Burger of Orangeburg, the 2006 Junior Champion, finished runner-up after firing an eight under par 205 for the tournament. It will be Burger's third time facing the Georgians. Greenville's Crawford Reeves, also making his second appearance in the GA-SC Matches, was the third qualifier upon posting a five under par effort of 208. Fourteen year old Stephen Behr of Florence, won his age division and finished tied for fourth over all with Hilton Head's Logan Daber and Newberry's Martin Summer, all shooting a score of one under par 212. Other top finishers and GA-SC Junior Team qualifiers are Brad Sill of Spartanburg and Easley's Corbin Mills. Thirty-two years ago, Pete Cox of the Georgia State Golf Association and Charles Rountree, Jr. of the South Carolina Golf Association formalized the idea of the GA - SC team matches. The winning team has their victory inscribed on the beautiful Rountree - Cox trophy that was donated by the Rountree family. Every junior that has participated in the 31 year old competition, will find his name on the trophy with his teammates. The Junior Championship is one of 18 SCGA statewide championships, 73 one-day contests, nine USGA qualifiers, eight 40-plus tournaments and five special events conducted by the SCGA. 40th Annual Father Son Championship

Columbia SC - Steve and Chase Liebler shot an amazing eight under par 64 to capture the 2007 Father Son Championship by five shots over Bill and Will Oldham from Spartanburg. This is the second Father Son title for the Lieblers, the last came in 2003.

Playing a select drive alternate shot format, the Lieblers came out blazing making six birdies in their first nine holes to turn at 30. The Irmo duo managed three more birdies and a lone bogey on the par three 17th hole to finish with a 34 and total of 64, a new tournament record.

In other results, Paul and Ryan Turner shot 71 to win Division II. Jerry and Brad Sims were Division III champions with a 70. In Division IV Scott and Dustin Kennedy

shot 73 to capture first place. Brian and Corey Verhage took Division V with a 74. In the Pro Division, David and Cameron Lamb fired a 78 to beat out three other teams.



The 2007 SCGA Father Son Championship is one of 18 major championships hosted by the South Carolina Golf Association. The 40th Annual event was played on both the Columbia Country Club and The Windermere golf courses. Divisions I, II, along with the pro division competed at Columbia Country Club, while Divisions III, IV, and V competed at The Windermere Club.

Taylor Barrett is going to the 107th US Women's Amateur

Columbia, S.C. - South Carolina women's golfer <u>Taylor Barrett</u> has qualified for the 107th U.S. Women's Amateur Championship after advancing at a qualifier held at the Sapona Country Club in Lexington, N.C. on Thursday, July 5.

Barrett, a sophomore from York, S.C., posted a two-over par 73 to tie for tenth. She advanced by hitting a birdie on the third hole of a playoff round. "This is my first time at the Women's Amateur," Barrett said. "I've been in the Public Links three times. (This) was exciting because the Women's Amateur is bigger. I'm ready to see how I compete at a high level. I've qualified for six USGA events and qualified for them all in the playoffs. Qualifying like that is nerve-wracking but fun."

Barrett competed in six tournaments for the Gamecocks this season, posting a low round of 70 at the LSU/Cleveland Classic. Her best finish came at The Derby Invitational when she tied for 14th.

"It's exciting for (her just being) a rising sophomore," Coach Kristi Coggins said. "Taylor is such a great talent and competitor. I think she can go and win the whole thing because she's great at match play. I'm excited for her and to see how it ends up."The U.S. Women's Amateur is considered the highest honor in women's amateur golf. Play begins on Monday, Aug. 6 at the par-72 Crooked Stick Golf Club in Carmel, Ind. The Amateur will feature two rounds of stroke play to cut the field from 156 to 64, and then the golfers will compete in match play for four rounds. The final day of competition on Sunday, Aug. 12 will see the remaining two players going head-to-head for 36 holes of match play for the Championship

S.C. Junior Match Championship

Greenville, SC—Hayden Letien of Sumter, captured the medalist and the number one seed for match play by firing a 6 under par 66 in the stroke play qualifying of the SC Junior Match Play Championship. Letien, a 15 year old high school sophomore, recorded 2 eagles, 3 birdies and one bogey in his round on the 6,825 yard course at Furman University. Finishing one stroke behind was Crawford Reeves of Greenville. Haley Stephens of Greer was the girls' medalist after shooting round of 2 over par 74. In the boys 13 and under division, Tyler Williams of Hilton Head Island finished with a 3 under par 69 to secure the medalist award in his division.

Barrett graduated from York Comprehensive High School as the number one ranked golfer in the state. 


31st Lefty Righty Championship & 36th Lefthanders Championship




