Phoenix flourish at Wexford Intercollegiate



HILTON HEAD ISLAND, SC - Led by individual medalist Jimmy Lytle, Elon University rallied over the final 18 holes to claim a one-stroke win over Furman University at the third-annual Wexford Plantation Intercollegiate men's golf tournament, hosted by Francis Marion University on Hilton Head Island. The final round of the two-day, 54-hole event was played on Tuesday (Feb. 26) on the par 72, 6,828-yard Wexford Plantation course. Elon carded a final round 300 team score to finish at 890, while Furman slipped to a 305 tally on Tuesday and finished at 891. Furman had led after each of the first two rounds. Kennesaw State University placed third at 898 (297-298-303), while Francis Marion moved up two positions to finish fourth (294-306-300=900), only 10 strokes behind the Phoenix. FMU equaled Elon's 300 team score on

Tuesday for the second-lowest tally behind Bowling Green State University's 294. Presbyterian College finished fifth (298-301-303=902), followed by East Carolina University (299-298-306=903), USC Aiken (307-296-303=906), Winthrop University (304-296-307=907), Bowling Green State (311-308-294=913), Wofford College (294-307-315=916), George Washington University (304-298-318=920), Marshall University (306-304-317=927), and a three-way tie for 13th: Davidson College (317-309-323=949), Northern Illinois University (310-314-325=949), and Oakland University (320-310-319=949). Lytle, a senior from Ocean Ridge, Fla., shot an even-par 72 on Tuesday to finish at 6-under-par 210 and cruised to a 9-stroke win. Oliver West of Kennesaw State placed second with a 70-76-73=219 scorecard, while Ben Goforth of Furman (75-72-73=220) and Jayson Judy of Elon (73-69-78=220) tied for fourth. Three players tied for fifth position: Pete Alminas of Winthrop (74-75-72=221), Hugh Morrison of Presbyterian (72-75-74=221), and Garrett Schneider of Furman (71-73-77=221). Both Lytle's 54-hole score and Elon's team score were records for the young tournament. Sophomore Christopher Couch and junior Keith Crowley led the Francis Marion golfers with 12th-place showings. Crowley shot a final round 74, while Couch carded a 75 on Tuesday as both finished at 8-over 224. Peter McGibney finished in a group tied for 16th position (74-76-75=225), while Ronan O'Connor (72-79-78=229) and Andrew Pitcher (74-79-76=229) tied for 31st place. Three other FMU golfers competed as individuals: Jacob Tveit also tied for 31st (73-78-78=229), freshman and West Florence High School product Cory Richards was 80th (80-89-88=257) and Jonathan Lavin was 81st (86-98-84=268).

AASU/Sothridge Pirate Invitational

SAVANNAH, Ga. - The Newberry Indian men's golf team completed the AASU/Southridge Pirate Invitational in fifth place after finishing the second round Tuesday morning with a team total of 299. Clayton State University (Ga.) was the tournament champion with a five over par team showing. Georgia College and State University completed play three strokes behind Clayton in second place.

Individually, Newberry freshman Ben Lown (North Augusta, S.C.) finished in 13th place after two-day stroke total of 147. Lown his first day 72 with a 75 on Tuesday.

Fellow freshman Stephen Holmes (Chapin, S.C.) placed in a tie for 14th with a two-day score of 148 and Daniel Stalney (Inman, S.C.), also a freshman, tied for 16th with a 149.

The individual tournament champion was Will Wilcox from Clayton State. Wilcox completed the tournament seven under-par.

However, the Ford's, both past City Champions, drew on their past success at The Muni and birdied 4 of the last 5 holes for the win.

In the Senior City 4-Ball, Nick Avery and Frank Dickson carded a 69 to claim the title. Billy Wise and Buddy Watkins stormed from 6 shots back, firing the lowest Senior Sunday round of 66, to finish second. The Saturday lead proved too much, as Avery and Dickson, the only team to break par on all four nines played over the weekend, coasted to the win.



Murray State Captures 2008 Shamrock Intercollegiate Title

Tega Cay SC - The Sixth Annual 2008 Shamrock Collegiate Invitational Tournament for collegiate women golfers was held March 21, 22, and 23 at Tega Cay Golf Club in Tega Cay, SC. Fourteen teams traveled here from as far as Iowa, South Dakota and Texas. The Shamrock was hosted by both Tega Cay Golf Club, and Winthrop College in Rock Hill, SC. Winthrop won last year and was looking for a repeat win.

On the first day Winthrop's Jutta Degerman from Kaunainen, Finland led the field by three strokes after firing a one-under 71. She helped Winthrop to a team total of 310, which trailed the day's team leader Charleston Southern by four strokes.

Susannah Aboff of Princeton shot the low round of day two with a 69. She led Princeton from a fourth place tie with Iowa to second place. However Charleston Southern maintained first as Winthrop dropped to third.

Murray State overcame an 11-stroke deficit in the third and final round to capture first place with a team total of 935. Murray State's final round 306 came from Bethany Yates, Alexandra Hinteregge, Joyce Trus, and Andrea Downer. One stroke behind was Princeton University with 936 in second place. Charleston Southern fell to third place with 939, and Winthrop dropped to fourth with 940.

The low medallist for the three days was Susannah Aboff of Princeton with 221 followed by Jutta Degerman of Winthrop with 223. Third place Michelle Grilli, also from Princeton, came in third this a score of 230. Winthrop's coach Jodi Wendt said that we will probably see both Susannah and Jutta on the LPGA soon.

The six-year old Shamrock Invitational Tournament drew participants from South Carolina colleges including Winthrop, The Citadel, University of SC Upstate, Presbyterian College, and Charleston Southern. Other participating colleges were Saint Francis, Murray State University, South Dakota State University, Xavier University, University of Iowa, Princeton University, Gardner-Webb, Tennessee State University, and Siena College.







Patriot Golfers earn first Division I win at William & Mary tourney

WILLIAMSBURG, VA – In just its first year as a full-fledged NCAA Division I program, the Francis Marion University golf team captured its first team win at that level by finishing seven strokes ahead of a 19-team field at the First Market Bank Intercollegiate Tournament, hosted by the College of William & Mary. The 36-hole event was played on Kingsmill's famed River Course, a par 71, 6,809-yard layout. Detroit Marcy's Mark Sommerfield sank a birdie on the first playoff hole to claim the individual medal, besting FMU sophomore Christopher Couch. Couch, a native of Summerville and a product of Stratford High School, shot a final-round, 4-under-par 67 to force the playoff. He ended the 36-hole tournament with a 137 score. Patriot junior Ronan O'Connor tied for fifth place at 69-74=143, while other FMU golfers included junior Peter McGibney (74-70=144) tied for ninth, junior Andrew Pitcher (73-74=147) tied for 22nd place, and junior Keith Crowley (78-72=150) tied for 41st position. Francis Marion led several statistical categories while winning the tournament, including lowest par-3 scoring (2.97), lowest par-4 scoring (4.17), and most birdies (33). Individually, Couch led the field with nine birdies for the two-day event, while O'Connor led in par-3 scoring at 2.63. Including its two-year transitional period, this is Francis Marion's best team finish as a Division I member since placing second at the 2005 Raines Development Group Intercollegiate. The win is FMU's first since the 2004 Peach Belt Conference Tournament, and the first regular-season team title since the 2003 AFLAC/Cougar Invitational in Columbus, Ga. Ironically, Francis Marion won the William & Mary Spring Invitational in 1998 as a Division II member

Francis Marion golfers finish 7th at USCA event

AIKEN, S.C.— Chattanooga completed their wire-to-wire runaway victory of the 11th Cleveland Golf Palmetto Intercollegiate on Tuesday with a final round of 282. The 16th-ranked Mocs (+10) won the event by 30 strokes over #29 Virginia Tech (+40), while Francis Marion placed seventh. USC Aiken (+41), the three-time defending champs of the event, placed third, one shot behind the Hokies. The 30-stroke victory shattered the tournament record for margin of victory by 15 shots, set ironically by Virginia Tech in 2002 over South Florida and the rest of the 15-team field.

The 54-hole event was contested at the 6,565 yard, par 70 Palmetto Golf Club in Aiken, S.C. Founded in 1892, Palmetto is recognized as the fourth oldest golf course in the United States and holds the oldest membership certificate to the USGA still in existence. The prestigious Division I field featured three teams ranked in the top 30 including #16 Chattanooga, #22 Penn State, and #29 Virginia Tech. Penn State (+50) finished nine back of USCA, while Elon (+52) completed an unchanged top five. Furman (+54) and Francis Marion (+55) switched places with each other while Charleston Southern (+60), Jacksonville State (+65), and UNC Greensboro (+72) rounded out the top 10. The round of the tournament belonged to Chattanooga's Jonathan Hodge who birdied three of his final five holes to shoot a two-day best three-under-par 67. Hodge improved from sixth after 36 holes to capture medalist honors at two-over-par 212. Jimmy Lytle of Elon, Chattanooga's Fredrik Qvicker, and Jurrian van der Vaart of Virginia Tech all tied for second at three-over-par 213. Christopher Couch led the FMU golfers with an 11th-place finish at 73-76-70=219. Andrew Pitcher (75-76-74=225) tied for 26th, while Ronan O'Connor (78-73-77=228) tied for 39th, and Peter McGibney (72-77-80=229) and Keith Crowley (77-77-75=229) tied for 41st

INSTRUCTIONS

Getting into high gear for this season

How many of you subscribe to golf magazines? How many swing tips are in those magazines? How often when you read in a magazine does there appear a tip and in the next magazine on the same subject it seems to contradict the previous magazine? Confusing isn't it?

We all want to enjoy our golf games at whatever commitment level we choose. Consider a different approach to your new golf season. You've likely had enough golf tips, mechanical suggestions, in your lifetime to become very confused. Consider the following idea. Never practice without a purpose or a goal, that can be the physical/mechanical part of golf or the inner game, the game of "self talk". My experience on ranges up and down the east coast tells me that virtually no one is practicing the mental game on the practice tee, only "golf swing" game. We are slaves to our subconscious mind...so let's use it to our advantage. Here's proof; tie your shoes as fast as you can, without thinking, chances are you could do both shoes in less than 15 seconds and tie them perfectly almost every time! The only consciousness used here was to think "tie my shoes"; the act was run by your subconscious. Oh, by the way, when you tied your shoes without thinking other than tie your shoes... you were in the "zone".

Now tie your shoes again only this time think through every motion that you make with your fingers to get the shoe tied... while you're doing it!! Chances are you'll take up more time than the average coffee break doing the task as you think of all the motions. Chuck Hogan says "our brains are perfect learners", and that everything we learn is via the "Cycle of Competency"; a phrase I first read about as an aspiring educator in the book "Magical Child". We learned our golf game through this cycle just as we learned to tie our shoes. The 'Cycle' is this; we imprint, repeat, habituate, and vary.

So, with this ground work laid, let's address a specific golf shot, the one from 75 yards over a bunker close to the green, the lie is fine and in the fairway, water is behind the green. We've all had this shot many, many times and chances are many of us get nervous, anxious and generally tense, next we consciously think of everything that we must do to make a good shot, and we say make sure not to hit it in the bunker or the water. This is a surefire recipe for trouble. I know you've practiced this shot, and if your set up, golf concepts, and ball positioning are good and you've envisioned the flight of the shot and practiced the swing which will give you the result you want, then things should go pretty well, right? So, all we need to do is to swing the club as we've practiced without thinking about it. In other words... tie your shoes. This idea can work just as easily with any shot in golf.

Here's my suggestion to getting better results with your golf shots; chose the shot and the club, set up, aim, and align properly, then just hit the shot and let your only thought be one of perfect balanced finish position. That should be easy, we know what that looks like. It's like tying your shoes folks, you just say tie them and the action happens. So if you swing to a balanced finish position then the proper motion is created. If the motion is poor we won't be balanced. It's just that simple!

Let's stop playing golf swing and let's hit golf shots, stop thinking of the "how" and start thinking of the "what", the ball going to the target. If you commit to this approach and stick to it throughout the year you'll not only be preparing yourself for a better year, it will be a better year. 





American Team Claims 10th Annual Can-Am Junior Team Matches

Cooler and windier conditions didn't deter either player, however, Bradshaw made a strong move, winning three consecutive holes and never looked back. He closed out his match five up and earned 15 points. Will Ovenden of Spartanburg followed Bradshaw's lead winning the front nine and then claiming four consecutive holes on the back to also earn a nine point margin of victory, six up over Brian Churchill-Smith. Florence's Mitch Gray and Richard Jung of Ontario swapped pars all day long until the long par 4 sixteenth hole when Gray took the lead and never let it go. He proceeded to claim the beautiful 18th and win his Match two up, earning 12 ½ points to win by a margin of four. Corbin Mills of Easley didn't have as much success

but made a strong push on the back nine only to fall short on 18 to lose one down and allow Albin Choi a four point win. The remaining Matches were all U.S. Greenville's Crawford Reeves had three birdies and an eagle to win one up and take home 11 ½ points over Mitch Sutton. Sophomore Austin Cody of North Charleston won both sides of his Match with Scott Landreth and took a 13 ½ point tally. Wesley Bryan of Chapin dominated his Match versus 14 year-old Brandon Ng and finished three-up to claim another 13 ½ points. Canada's Michael Gligic never got it going and the ever consistent and 2007 SCJGA Junior Player of the Year, Orangeburg's Jacob Burger, took advantage winning his Match up 11 and brining in a whopping 17 ½ points to end the day. Overall, the 2008 Can Am Junior Team Matches were a success in terms of growing the game and strengthening the relationship between neighboring countries. The American team tallied a total of 152 ½ points to Canada's 99 ½ to win the 10th annual edition of the Matches.
