NEW CHAMPION TO BE CROWNED AT CAROLINAS JUNIOR JULY 29-31 AT CHECHESSEE CREEK IN OKATIE, SC,

WEST END, NC - With 2007 winner Lee Bedford of Cary, NC out of this year's competition, it will be difficult to pick a favorite when the 59th Junior Championship of the Carolinas Golf Associataion is played July 29-31 at Chechessee Creek Club near Bluffton, SC.



Justin Clement of Lexington, the No. 3-ranked junior in North Carolina, is certainly a possible choice; as is Mitchell Gray of Florence, the fifth ranked junior in South Carolina. Other potential champions include Drew Lankford of Charlotte, NC, whose

69 led the 24 qualifiers at the CC of Orangeburg, SC on July 21; and Bobby Baysden of Ernul, NC and John Gillespie of Pinehurst, whose 67s paced the 32 successful qualifiers at Whispering Woods GC in Whispering Pines, NC on July 23.

The 54-hole stroke play tournament will be played on the par-70 Chechessee Creek Club layout, which was designed by Ben Crenshaw and Bill Coore and opened in 2000. The course will play at 6,606 yards for the 14-15 and 16-18 age divisions, at 5,549 yards for the 12-13 age bracket and at 4,895 yards for the 11-and-under group. The club has previously hosted two CGA championships — the 2003 Carolinas Amateur and the 2004 Carolinas Mid-Amateur.

This year's winner gets possession of the M.K. Jeffords Trophy for the ensuing year, while the top two finishers in the older division are invited to play on the Carolinas team that will compete against a similar team from the Virginias in their annual matches. The matches will be played Aug. 9-10 at The Club at Irish Creek in Kannapolis, NC.

He will receive the scholarship sum of \$2500 over the course of twosemesters.Ron Schmid, Carolinas PGA Executive Director, says, "I am confident Nicholas Calcagno understandswhat it means to receive the Labron Harris Scholarship in memory of Coach Myers. Certainly he couldnot be representing a finer individual and we wish Nicholas the best of luck as he embarks on his collegecareer."

Ouzts Wins Charleston City Junior Championship

Charleston, South Carolina -Michael Ouzts captured the 54th Annual Al Esposito City Junior Golf Championship held at the Municipal Golf Course in Charleston, South Carolina. Ouzts, from Manning, South Carolina, whose 73 was the low round of the day, played the back nine in one-under 35 to claim a 2 shot victory over Taylor Zoller. Birdies on 10 and 12 gave Ouzts a cushion over fellow first-day co-leader Zoller. However, Zoller played the final 4 holes in 2 under to keep to pressure on Ouzts. Ouzts kept his composure and parred in from the 13th to secure his first Charleston City Championship. Defending champion Trey Dennis finished in 3rd.

Anna-Raquel Robison won the Girls Overall City Championship. Robison bested Amelia Goodwin by 10 shots.

Bradley Tedstone, from Simpsonville, South Carolina, claimed the Boys 13-14 Year old age championship. Tedstone's final round 75 leap-frogged first day leader Jackson Moore.

Evan Rodwell shot 2-under par 34, for a two day total of 3 under par 69, to claim the Boys 10 - 12 Year old division.

Nathalie Lezcano won the Girls 10-12 Year Old division over second place finisher Kate Harper.


Will Byrd held off a late charge by Ryan Pitts to claim the Boys 9 and Under Championship.


41st Annual Father-Son Championship The Windermere Club


Cody Takes Medalist Honors

27 players made the Amateur field at Musgrove Mill with a score of 74 or better.





INSTRUCTIONS

Last month I wrote about the performance of Rocco Mediate in the U.S. Open and his Ballard esque swing and single plane set up. This month I'd like to delve more deeply into this single plane idea since I've received many calls and e-mails from last month's installment.



There is currently much writing and discussion going on in the world of golf instruction focused on Swing Plane. We have also received many questions from Natural Golf devotees regarding Jim Hardy's theory pertaining to his book "The Plane Truth" and if his recommended swing mechanics for the "one plane swing" apply to Natural Golfers. I will clarify Natural Golf's definition of Single Plane so you can continue down a simple path to better golf. First and foremost, Natural Golf uses the shaft of the golf club to define the plane of the swing. We say a swing is single plane when the shaft angle at address matches the shaft angle at impact. Tiger Woods recently said "there have been only two people who have "owned" their swings, Ben Hogan and Moe Norman". In the photo below is the great Moe Norman, the greatest ball striker of all time, you can see plainly that Moe is addressing the ball at set up in single plane and returns there at impact.










Ideally, the shaft would stay on this inclined plane throughout the entire swing; much like the shaft movement created by the golf club testing machine, Iron Byron, used by the USGA. And, much like the shaft movement of a club as swung by Moe Norman (pictured above). By starting at address with your arms aligned with the club shaft, you can swing back and forward on virtually the same swing path or on a single plane, we believe there is no simpler move in golf. It mimics the direct strike of driving a nail with a hammer, the way you hold the tool aligns your arm with the handle and a single plane motion is the most natural and most direct motion to use. Jim Hardy defines a swing as "one plane" when the shoulders and lead arm are on the same plane at the top of the backswing. While he references a difference in setup between one and two plane swings, he does not use shaft angle as the criteria. Because the two methods use different criteria to define One or Single Plane, the swing mechanics of each method are not completely interchangeable. By using the Natural Hold on the club (a ten fingered grip) it automatically aligns your arms with the club shaft at address. Swinging the club on an arc around your body with your arms will deliver the club through impact with a square clubface sending the ball to your target. By paying close attention to the Natural Golf Single Plane Setup, you will simply have to focus your attention on the direction of the forward swing path to create a Single Plane Swing.





Naturalness dictates that club path control is directed by the arms and hands. Because of Natural Golf's Single Plane Setup, your body will move to accommodate the direction you choose to move your arms. There will be some shoulder turn in the backswing as your arms move the club on a Single Plane and some shoulder turn in the forward swing to accommodate this same plane (swing) direction. Your weight will transfer from trail foot to lead foot also; this inherent body motion will amplify the speed of your arm

swing to increase power. The faster you move the club with your arms the more your body will move in accommodation. Trying to add body motion to create arm speed will almost always throw the club shaft off the Single Plane direction. Think of it this way...if you want to drive a nail harder, do you try to turn your shoulders more, or drive your hips? Probably not, at least not consciously...you simply move the hammer faster with your arm, any extra body motion occurs in accommodation of your intended arm speed. It's a lot like throwing a ball. When you intend to throw farther, you move your arm faster and in accommodation, your body moves in anticipation and support of your intent to increase arm speed. For example, when you throw really far you will most likely take a step in the direction of the throw just prior to accelerating your arm in that direction. The step toward the target and the body motion it entails occur because of your intent to throw far using your arm. Moe Norman showed us a simple setup that produced a simple and remarkably repeatable swing. Natural Golf follows his lead with our Natural Hold that leads to a Single Plane Setup so we can use the most direct strike in golf...a Single Plane Swing.

Brays Island

Referring to Brays Island Plantation as a golf community makes about as much sense as referring to Ronald Reagan as an actor.

Sure "The Gipper" was a celluloid mainstay in the 30s,40s, and 50s, appearing in some 60 different films. But of course his thespian career was greatly overshadowed by his



political one, and to the world at large, Reagan will always be a President. So it is at bucolic Brays Island, less than 60 miles south of Charleston. There's an excellent Ron Garl designed golf course on the premises, one that receives as little playing pressure as virtually any course in the Lowcountry. Golf at Brays Island, pleasant and pastoral as it is, is just a single element, some might call it an ancillary element, of a vibrant and outdoorsy community where hunting and horses hold at least as much appeal as birdies and bogeys. The course sits naturally on the site and quietly on the land "says architect Ron Garl with obvious pride. Speaking of the single most notable feature of the facility, he says, "The routing was influenced by the large live oaks and the hammocks of trees that flourish on the property. These native trees outline the playing corridors, serve as backdrops and occasionally influence the line of play." There are several reasons the course is excellent, and paramount among them is the routing plan. Director of Golf Mike Ingram, who's been at his post since the day the course opened in 1989, explains, "We wanted the course to flow naturally around the plantation and not be a visual intrusion. The course was designed so it would be screened from the outside like our

other amenities, and not that visible or noticeable except from the interior. Some people refer to it as an 18-hole nature walk. Taking it one step further, on the outward nine, especially, it's like a golf safari. At some point between the first fairway and green, a player loses sight of the golf house. From then on, it's a ramble in the woods, totally peaceful, with no condos, concrete or cart paths intruding. Instead, a startled golfer might come across a flock of wild turkeys or perhaps see a red tailed hawk circling above. Here's the Brays Island philodophy in a nutshell: "We only took down a dozen trees, if that, during construction," says Garl. Does that sound claustrophobic? No room to breathe, never mind his spectacular slices? Perish the thought. "The holes occur naturally in open meadow or on land that had been previously cultivated for use on the plantation, "continues the architect. Our disturbance of the natural landscape was absolutely minimal."




